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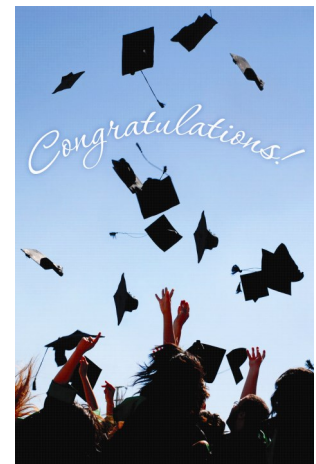

Deacon Nomination

This summer we will be electing two deacons to replace Lee Elledge and Will Stokes who will be rotating off the Diaconate. Deacons shall be elected from active, resident male and female members over the age of 21. The primary task of the deacon is to provide pastoral ministries through the Deacon Family Ministry Plan.

The description of the qualifications are as follows:

Description

In accordance with the meaning of the work and practice in the New Testament, deacons are to be servants of the church. The task of the deacon is to support the pastor in his leading the church, proclaiming the gospel and caring for members of the church and community. Deacons are not granted any administrative authority. Their activities should be guided by the ideal of serving as servants of the church.

Duties

To serve the Lord's Supper.

To minister to assigned church member families, providing for the family:

regular prayer,

friendship,

emotional support,

witnessing to family members,

assistance in answering faith, church, or denominational questions,

promoting fellowship with other members,

helping members find a place of service within the church

visits and special attention to widowed, shut-in, hospitalized or ill members.

To support the leading and work of the pastor in:

- sharing the gospel
- promoting unity within the church
- addressing any murmuring or grumbling within the church
- providing a proper example for church members, including regular attendance and participation in church activities.

Qualifications

◆ Biblical: The Biblical qualifications are listed in 1 Timothy 3, as follows:

Deacons, likewise, should be worthy of respect, not hypocritical, not drinking a lot of wine, not greedy for money, holding the mystery of the faith with a clear conscience. And they must also be tested first; if they prove blameless, then they can serve as deacons. Wives, too, must be worthy of respect, not slanderers, self-controlled, faithful in everything. Deacons must be husbands of one wife, managing their children and their own households competently. For those who have served well as deacons acquire a good standing for themselves, and great boldness in the faith that is in Christ Jesus.

– 1 Timothy 3:8-13 (HCSB)

◆ Other Constitutional Requirements:

1. Active church member for at least one year and in good standing.
2. Over the age of 21.
3. No two members of one immediate family (the same household) will serve as deacon at the same time.
