## ORDINATION

Christian Churches have traditionally used the practice of ordination to "set apart" individuals for a particular task or for a particular role in the church. Baptists have traditionally used a formal process of ordination for the roles of Deacon and Minister in a local congregation. The ordination service normally includes the "laying on of hands." As Christians, we have inherited this practice from Old Testament Judaism. Moses commissioned Joshua to be his replacement through the laying on of hands. In Genesis 48, Jacob blessed his grandsons through the laying on of hands. This symbolic act includes both the elements of blessing and designation for a particular task.

In the New Testament, Acts 6 tells of the selection of seven men who were put in charge of the financial care of the widows within the Jerusalem Church. They were chosen by the congregation, brought before the Apostles, and after prayer had hands laid upon them. In Acts 13, Barnabas and Saul were appointed to lead a major missionary endeavor and as a part of their commissioning they received the "laying on of hands."

This Sunday, we will set apart Sandy and Mary Lynn to serve as Deacons at CRBC. We will pray that God will bless their service here at CRBC. When we get to the "laying on of hands" they will be seated in front of the congregation. Those who would like to participate will form a line and individually come by and offer a prayer, a blessing, or a word of encouragement. Normally when the prayer is being offered, the hands are laid on the top of the head or on the shoulders. As a congregation, we give thanks for their service in the past and ask God's blessings on them as they accept this new role.
